With this letter we would like to officially inform you about our **positive decision on EVS accreditation of MultiKultiUA.**

Details of the accreditation

You can submit new EVS Accreditation Application, but not earlier than three months after the date of the issue of the decision regarding accreditation.

Comments to organisation after the accreditation process:

MultiKulti is a big organisation in terms of a number and variety of projects. It has experience with hosting international trainees (IFPs) and sending volunteers abroad though FOJ and FSJ, as well as au-pairs. It does have a potential to be a very successful EVS organisation, due to its experience and capacities. In general we believe that MultiKulti can manage the projects on a good quality level. As this is the first experience with the EVS, we would suggest to start with sending projects and after go for hosting. This is to find a comfortable way of working with the programme, check if partnership works and see if EVS is something for you.

Please pay attention to trainings and full-time engagement for the volunteers. Anna Myrvoda (EVS Coordinator) is at the moment the most experienced person in the organisation in terms of EVS. If she decides to leave at any point it is better to have a second person in the organisation with the good level of knowledge about the programme. To achieve this we would also advice for MultiKulti coordinators and prospective mentors to apply and attend SALTO EECA events dedicated to EVS. It will give you the most recent information about the programme and provide opportunity to meet other organisations active in EVS.

If the organisation decides to involve volunteers in their projects with partners, please make sure it is really minor part of work and has clear connection to MultiKulti projects. In terms of volunteers possibilities for socialisation and involvement in local community MultiKulti does stand out with the range of activities. There are a number of current projects of MultiKulti where volunteers can be involved. Thanks to variety of projects, and hosting of IFPs, the EVS volunteers will have a good chance to build connections and work on own projects.

We highly encourage you and your staff to take part in annual meetings of EVS coordinators and EVS mentors, as well in international trainings about EVS.

The decision was taken by SALTO Eastern Europe and Caucasus Resource Centre, as institution responsible for EVS accreditation in Eastern Partnership countries and Russia. The decision was made on the basis of recommendation from external accreditor(s) after:

- the process of assessing documents provided by your organisation,
- meeting with the external accreditor(s), as well as
- consulting phase after the meeting which was the opportunity to provide additional information, clarifications or assurances regarding your Accreditation Application.
